

Outstanding Volunteer Efforts Award Recipients for 2008

Dr. Alan Sand, has been collecting Secchi disk readings on Dragon Lake in the Cariboo Region for over ten years and added temperature/DO profiles to his monitoring efforts in 2007. The DO/T data is quite valuable to MoE because it provides a picture of warmer temperatures which are not favourable for the very important strain rainbow trout on Dragon Lake. Eggs from these trout are used for ~ 1/3 of lake stocking in BC.
